EMERGENCY REGISTRATION FOR PSYCHOLOGICAL SERVICES IN LOUISIANA:

On, August 30, 2008 Governor Bobby Jindal Jindal issued **Executive Order BJ 08-83** (www.doa.louisiana.gov/osr#B70B0) declaring a statewide public health emergency in preparation for Hurricane Gustav. If you would like to register to volunteer psychological services, the following is required:

1. Register with this agency.

a. If you are an out-of state psychologist, licensed to practice psychology in another jurisdiction of the United States, download and complete the [Emergency Temporary Registration](#) form from this website.

2. Register with LAVA at <https://www.lava.dhh.louisiana.gov/>

a. Once your registration is received by the LSBEP, or if you are already licensed with the LSBEP, contact the Louisiana Volunteers in Actions (LAVA) through their website link above. LAVA is administered by the Louisiana Department of Health and Hospitals, Office of Public Health. LAVA works to recruit, credential, train, manage and deploy volunteers (medical and non-medical) to assist during emergencies and day to day activities by providing additional staff to meet health/medical surge needs.
